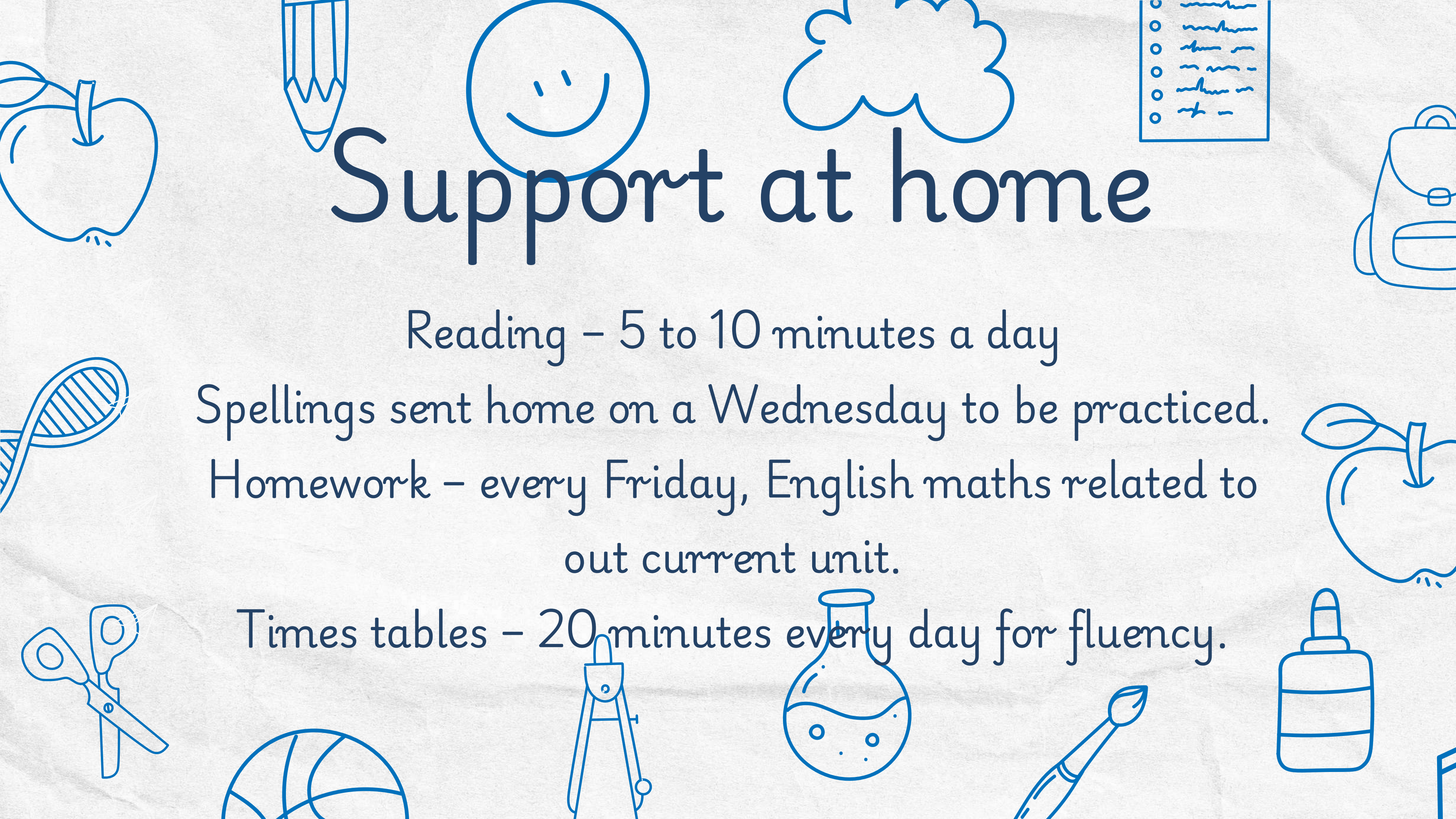




Multiplication Check
